The goal of the Awana ministry is to help equip parents and leaders as they guide the children God has entrusted into their care into spiritual development.



As parents we encourage you to work with your child in their Awana handbook.

- Help them memorize the Bible verse and talk with them about what that verse means and how they can use it in their life.
- Read the Bible passages and answer the questions as a family.
- Use your children's handbooks for family devotions, or have a family Scripture memory contest!

The handbooks have tools and practical suggestions to help you as you learn and study together. Just a few minutes a day can yield eternal rewards! Find what incentives work for your child! Awana clubs may offer incentives and awards throughout the program but you can also reward your child for meeting your expectations as well!

Most clubs invite parents to visit their child's club anytime, but check with your church to see what needs to be done before your visit.

Deuteronomy 11:18-21, God instructs parents to... "Therefore you shall lay up these words of mine in your heart and in your soul, and bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall teach them to your children, speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land of which the Lord swore to your fathers to give them, like the days of the heavens above the earth."
